

“Share, don’t dare” pileup

CLASSROOM LESSON PLAN

Objective

To teach kids what’s safe to share — and what isn’t — so they can help stop the spread of germs.

Ages

4 and up

Time

15 minutes

Materials

Common, everyday items, including:

- Books
- Pencils
- Combs
- Brushes
- Tissues
- Tools
- Trucks
- Toys
- Toothbrushes
- Whistles
- Crayons
- Dolls
- Stuffed animals
- Hats
- Cups and forks

Instructions

- 1 Explain to kids that germs can make them sick and are spread by touch.
- 2 Tell them that “sharing is fun, but getting sick isn’t,” and that there are certain things they should and shouldn’t share with each other.
- 3 To help them sort it out, hold up each item and ask, “Can we share this?”
- 4 Make piles of things they can and can’t share, and explain why; then post the “Share / Don’t Dare” chart to help remind them.

Remember: Germs are spread by touch, so kids should wash their hands (and teachers should wash the classroom’s hard, nonporous surfaces) regularly, even after using items that are OK to share.
